
# Minister for Foreign Affairs Recognizes Ralph Davies Munro, Former Washington State Secretary of State

On November 11, a major milestone in Japanese aviation was reached as Mitsubishi Aircraft Corporation (MITAC) and Mitsubishi Heavy Industries, Ltd. conducted their maiden flight of the all-new Mitsubishi Regional Jet (MRJ), Japan's first-ever commercial jet with seating for 70 to 90 passengers. The successful one-and-a-half-hour test flight out of Nagoya Airport confirmed basic characteristics and functionality with maneuvers off Japan's Pacific Coast.
