Instructions for Applying through the Consulate-General of Japan in Seattle

Note: Applicants who submit late and/or incomplete applications may be disqualified. Please carefully read the Application Guidelines and follow all instructions.

Application Instructions:

1. Follow the link to the Study in Japan website.
2. Carefully read the Application Guidelines for the scholarship you wish to apply for.
3. Download and complete the Application Form and all additional documents.
4. Collect all supplemental documents (see Application Guidelines, pages 5-7).
5. Number each document and make the necessary number of copies, as instructed in the Application Guidelines.
6. Mail all of your application materials in *one packet* to the address above.

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be U.S. citizens living in Washington, Montana, Idaho, Oregon, or Alaska. Please contact the nearest Japanese Embassy/Consulate in your area if you do not reside in our jurisdiction.
- If you possess and maintain dual citizenship with Japan and the U.S. you are not eligible to apply for the Japanese Government Scholarship unless you renounce your Japanese citizenship.
- You must meet the other requirements of age, academic background, etc. as stipulated in the Application Guidelines.

Preliminary Selection:

Qualified candidates will be contacted and asked to visit the Consulate-General of Japan in Seattle for an exam and interview. Exams and interviews are tentatively scheduled for June 13-14, but these dates are subject to change.
