

Important Guidance on Japan's Border Control Measures Related to COVID-19 for Foreign Nationals in the U.S.

Consulate-General of Japan in Seattle

The Government of Japan (GOJ) has implemented multi-layer border control measures in order to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. Due to the complex nature of these measures, the Embassy has created this guidance to highlight the essential points which are applicable to the majority of foreign nationals currently living/staying in the United States. 1. Denial of Permission to Enter

Until further notice, the **GOJ will deny permission to enter Japan to those foreign nationals who have been physically present in the U.S. or other countries/regions listed in the below link in the 14 days prior to their arrival to Japan**, as they fall under Article 5, paragraph (1), item (xiv) of the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act, **unless there are "Exceptional Circumstances."**

Note: Foreign nationals with the "Special Permanent Resident" status are NOT subject to Article 5, paragraph (1), item (xiv) of the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act. Therefore, they will not be denied permission to enter Japan based on Japan's Border Control Measures Related to COVID-19.

<Exceptional Circumstances>

Foreign nationals who fall under the cases below are considered to be under Exceptional Circumstances.

◇ RE-ENTRY

Foreign nationals with Status of Residence (regardless of its category) who have departed from Japan with a valid

Re-entry Permit/Special Re-entry Permit.

◇ NEW ENTRY

Foreign nationals who will newly enter Japan (i.e. enter Japan without re-entry permit) under the cases below **with a proper entry visa of Japan** depending on the purpose of their entry:

- Foreign nationals who have departed from Japan on or before August 31, 2020 with a valid Re-entry Permit/Special Re-entry Permit, but have been unable to re-enter Japan because the validity of the permit has expired after their departure from Japan.
- The spouse or child of a Japanese national or permanent resident of Japan.
- The spouse or child of a foreign national with the status of residence of "Long-term resident" whose family is staying in Japan and who have been separated from their family.
- A foreign national who is going to acquire the status of "Instructor" or "Professor" and who needs to enter Japan to fill a vacancy at the educational institution s/he is employed by or will be employed by, provided such a vacancy would result in the suspension of educational activities at the above-mentioned educational institution.
- A foreign national who is going to acquire the status of "Medical Services" and will contribute to the enhancement and strengthening of the Japanese medical profession.
- **Those who are eligible for "Phased Measures toward Resuming Cross-Border Travel" (SUSPENDED)**
Starting from October 1, 2020, [1] foreign nationals with a Certificate of Eligibility (this includes all types of Status of Residence except for "diplomatic" and "official") who intend to enter Japan for a mid to long term stay, as well as [2] those who intend to enter Japan for a short-term stay for the purpose of temporary business will, in principle, be incrementally permitted to enter Japan under the condition that the person is hosted by a company/entity that can assure the observation of quarantine measures. However, the number of people who will be permitted to enter Japan will be restricted. Foreign nationals intending to enter Japan using this scheme should apply for the entry visa (even for a short-term stay) and will need to submit the same documents as the applicants of the "Residence Track."

Note:

- On December 26, 2020, the Government of Japan announced the suspension of the Phased Measure for Resuming Cross- Border Travel above. This suspension had been implemented from December 28, 2020 till the end of January 2021.

- On January 13, 2021, the suspension was extended till lifting of the State of Emergency.
- On March 18, 2021, the suspension was decided to remain in effect for the time being.

◇ OTHERS

Foreign nationals who do not fall under the cases above, but have been acknowledged to have special exceptional circumstances (e.g. cases that require humanitarian consideration) by the Japanese authorities.

< Negative Test Result prior to departure from the U.S.>

With a few limited exceptions, **ALL foreign nationals** (Re-entry and New entry) who are under Exceptional Circumstances, in principle, are also required to obtain a “**Certificate of Negative Test Result**” before departing the U.S. for Japan (the test must be conducted within 72 hours of the intended departure). They will be denied entry into Japan if they fail to submit the certificate upon their arrival to Japan (Therefore, airlines will not give them permission to board an aircraft departing for Japan without the certificate). 2. Quarantine Measures

In addition to obtaining the above-mentioned pre-departure certificate of negative test result, all people traveling from the U.S. (including Japanese nationals) will be required to take COVID-19 tests again after arriving at their port of entry in Japan, to stay at a location designated by the quarantine station chief (own residence, etc.) and to refrain from using public transportation (including trains, buses, taxis, or domestic flights) for 14 days after entering Japan.

Furthermore, upon entry into Japan, all people must submit written pledges stating that they accept and will comply with self-quarantine procedures, which include but are not limited to, reporting health conditions to the public health center or related institutions every day for 14 days and installing on their mobile device a COVID-19 ContactConfirming Application designated by the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare. If they violate the pledge, they may be subject to detention, revocation of status of residence, or deportation.

3. Suspension of Visa Validity

- (2) While the validity of visas issued by the Embassy/Consulates in the U.S. have NOT been suspended, foreign nationals with a valid entry visa of Japan that was issued on or before April 2, 2020 will, in principle, be subject to “Denial of Permission to Enter.”
- (3) Those foreign nationals intending to newly enter Japan (without Re-entry Permit/Special Re-entry Permit) who are under Exceptional Circumstances will be allowed to apply for a visa.

4. Suspension of Visa Exemption Measures

- (2) While the Visa exemption measure to U.S. citizens has NOT been suspended, those U.S. citizens who intend to newly enter Japan without a proper entry visa will, in principle, be subject to “Denial of Permission to Enter.”
