1. Tokyo Nutrition for Growth Summit

On December 7 and 8, the Government of Japan hosted the <u>Tokyo Nutrition for Growth</u> <u>Summit (Tokyo N4G)</u>, an international conference to promote global efforts to improve nutrition-related matters. The <u>conference included discussions on health</u>, food, <u>resilience</u>, finance and accountability, with the goal of leading global agendas for improving malnutrition and compiling financial and policy commitments in the field of nutrition.

During his remarks, Prime Minister KISHIDA announced that Japan will provide nutritionrelated assistance to the world, which will amount to over 300 billion Japanese yen, equivalent to more than around 2.8 billion U.S. dollars, for the next three years.

H.E. Ms. Samantha Power, Administrator of USAID (2:17:15), and Mr. Bill Gates of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (2:33:55) both made statements at the High Level Sessions.

Leading up to the Summit, PM Kishida <u>spoke with Mr. Bill Gates</u> (Japanese press release) . PM Kishida expressed hope to strengthen ties with the Gates Foundation to respond to the spread of the Omicron variant of the virus among other international health issues.

The sculpture was created by artist John Zylstra. "Camp Harmony," was the nickname of the facility formally known as the Puyallup Assembly Center. The Washington State Fairgrounds is now at that site.
