## 1. Japan-U.S. Summit Video Teleconference Meeting

On January 21, Prime Minister Kishida held a Japan-U.S. summit video teleconference meeting with President Biden.

The two leaders shared the intention to coordinate closely under the strong Japan-U.S. Alliance and to deepen cooperation with like-minded countries toward realizing a "Free and Open Indo-Pacific." In this regard, Prime Minister Kishida expressed his intention to host the Japan-Australia-India-U.S. (QUAD) Summit Meeting in Japan in the first half of this year by inviting President Biden to Japan.

They also exchanged their views on the recent regional issues, including North Korea's nuclear and missile activities, and the situation in Ukraine.

# **2.** Foreign Policy Speech by Foreign Minister Hayashi to the 208th Session of the Diet

At the 208th Session of the National Diet of Japan, Foreign Minister Hayashi outlined Japan's foreign policy. Some of the main points included dealing with the increasingly severe security environment, promoting a free and open Indo-Pacific vision, COVID-19, and expanding a free and fair economic order.

## **3.** <u>Emergency Assistance Activity for the Damage Caused by Volcanic Eruption</u> <u>and Tsunami Disaster in the Kingdom of Tonga</u>

In response to the damage caused by the volcanic eruption and tsunami disaster in Tonga, on January 22, Japan delivered 3 tons of drinking water as the first batch of emergency relief goods to be provided through the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA).

On January 21, Japan and the U.S. released the "Japan-U.S. Joint Statement on the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT)."
