1. Japan's Response to Military Actions by Russia in Ukraine

In response to recent actions taken by Russia in Ukraine, FM Hayashi made statements regarding Japan's response including sanction measures, and efforts towards stabilization of the energy market. FM Hayashi stated that Japan condemns Russia's actions in the strongest terms and

will continue to make efforts to improve the situation in cooperation with the international community, including the G7, standing with Ukraine and its people.

Prime Minister Kishida also made <u>statements</u> regarding the <u>situation in Ukraine</u>. "We will do everything in our capacity to gather information first and foremost and grasp the actual situation," Kishida said. "Whatever the case may be, the situation is tense, and I intend to engage with this matter acting in cooperation with the G7 as well as the international community."

2. The Fourth Japan-Australia-India-U.S. (Quad) Foreign Ministers' Meeting On February 11, FM Hayashi attended the Fourth Japan- Australia-India-U.S. (Quad)

Foreign Ministers' Meeting in Melbourne, Australia. The four ministers reaffirmed the recognition that the existing international order has

been under challenge in various fields, including unilateral attempts to change the status quo and economic coercion, and that the responsibility of the four countries, which share fundamental values and are committed to promoting a free and open international order based on the rule of law, is increasing even more. During his visit to Australia, FM Hayashi also participated in bilateral and trilateral

meetings with the U.S., and the U.S. and the Republic of Korea, respectively.

3. Visit of the IAEA Officials to Japan for Safety Review of the Handling of

ALPS Treated Water at the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power **Station** From February 14 to 18, IAEA officials and international experts visited Japan. During

the visit, they conducted an IAEA's Safety Review on ALPS-treated water at TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station (FDNPS) and held meetings with relevant ministries and Tokyo Electric Power Company (TEPCO) to discuss cooperation regarding the handling of ALPS-treated water. In the meetings with METI and TEPCO, based on the IAEA's safety standards, the mission experts reviewed technical aspects related to the radiological characterization of

the water to be discharged, the safety-related aspects of the water discharge process, and Japan's assessment of the radiological environmental impact regarding the protection of people and the environment. The report of the review mission is expected to be issued by the IAEA in April.

Following the visit, on February 24, a video conference briefing session for diplomatic missions was held. In the session, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of

Economy, Trade and Industry explained the overview of the visit of the IAEA's officials to Japan. 44 participants from 34 countries and regions attended the session.

On March 2, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan and the International Organization for Migration (IOM) will host the FY2021 "International Forum on
